

### Here at The Prince of Wales Hospice, we can only describe local florist, Michelle Grainger, of Michelle's Flowers in Pontefract, as one of our most passionate supporters.

To date, Michelle has raised over  $\mathfrak{L}39,000$  for the Hospice and she's not ready to stop yet! To mark her 50th birthday, which she celebrated in February, Michelle is embarking on 50 challenges to mark her 50 years, to raise  $\mathfrak{L}30,000$  for our Hospice.

She has called her campaign 'nifty at fifty' and we certainly agree! To name just a few of her upcoming fundraisers, Michelle will be shaving her head, getting a tattoo of the Hospice feathers, taking on a zip wire over Mount Snowdon and putting on her dancing shoes to organise the popular event, Ponte Dance.

Talking about why she supports The Prince of Wales Hospice, Michelle said: "My Dad was admitted to the Hospice the month before he passed, as we were having difficulty managing his condition at home. During his two-week stay, the team tailored his medication to manage his pain and helped us all as a family to come to terms with his illness.

"I first wanted to support the Hospice because of our experience dealing with my Dad at home, we wanted to give something back. I wanted to help everyone else to see it (the Hospice) how we see it; A place for everyone and their families, who need support with terminal illness. Somewhere that is dignified, peaceful and friendly."

In June, Michelle completed her 14th challenge, the Pontefract 10k, which

saw her fundraising total exceed £10,000. Michelle said;

"Completing my first ever 10k race just days after walking the 109 miles of the Cleveland Way National Trail was a huge challenge, but totally worthwhile to smash my first milestone of £10,000 for the Hospice. I'm having a great time doing all the different challenges and I'm overwhelmed by all the support I've received from friends, family and complete strangers!"
