The charity scooter ride took place on Sunday 22 April, starting from The Prince of Wales Hospice.

The event was organised by one of our loyal supporters, Michelle Grainger of Michelle's Flowers, and the Pontefract Scooter Club. Talking about the event, Michelle said;

'I always aim to engage with the local community when I fundraise for The Prince of Wales Hospice, and for this event, I hoped to raise awareness for all Hospices across Yorkshire. Clinical update

We have recently reviewed and made minor changes to the incident report form and the medicines incident report form. The changes are;

- The medicines incident categories have been changed to bring the form in line with the Management of Medicine Incidents and Errors Standard Operating Procedure.
- A new incident report form has been developed to report patient falls. This should be completed for all witnessed and not witnessed patient falls, including controlled lowering to the floor.
- A Duty of Candour section has been added to both forms.

The Care Quality Commission Regulation 20: Duty of Candour is a statutory requirement that all providers of health and social care are open and honest with patients and their families when something goes wrong that appears to have caused harm or could lead to significant harm in the future.


Thank you also to the staff and volunteers who did a sterling job to make the day a success.

Childcare Vouchers

The Hospice has previously operated a childcare voucher scheme where parents can sacrifice an element of their salary to purchase childcare vouchers. These vouchers can then be used to off set the cost of childcare.

The Government has recently changed the way childcare costs are supported and as part of this has looked to limit the existing schemes on offer through employers. New parents wishing to access support for childcare costs will use the new 'Tax Free Childcare' system. Due to this change, the Hospice has made the decision that no new applications for childcare vouchers will be accepted with effect from April 2018. Any employees who are already using the old childcare voucher scheme will be able to continue to do so but we recommend that people also take the opportunity to look at the new scheme, as it may be more beneficial. 
