












Wish you were here...

Flu vaccines

The pharmacist will be here to give flu jabs the week commencing 7th October. He will be here every day that week between 1pm and 3pm. Vaccinations will take place in treatment room 3 and paperwork will be available on the day to complete.

According to www.nhs.uk the flu vaccine cannot give you flu. The injected flu vaccine given to adults contains inactivated flu viruses, so it cannot give you flu.

Your arm may feel a bit sore where you were injected, and some people get a slight temperature and aching muscles for a couple of days afterwards. Other reactions are very rare.

The viruses that cause flu can change every year, so you need a vaccination that matches the new viruses each year. The vaccine usually provides protection for the duration of that year's flu season.
